Shuttles purchased Online or at the tatting day in Hector, NY (2005 / 2006)

- Ia** England Aero (post style) The "England" shuttles are part of an Ebay auction I won (\$90); stated the shuttles were from the 1930s to 1960s
- Ib** England Aero (bobbin style)
- Ic** England Aero vs. German one (lower on), you can see that the bumps that hold the bobbin are much smaller, also, the England shuttle is a harder plastic so it is harder to get the bobbin in and out.
- II** No marking on this metal shuttle that was part of the England ebay purchase. It's a heavier metal than the newer Boye metal shuttles. The Tatting Shuttles of American Collector's 2002 book states that Aero did make a metal shuttle before the plastic one, so this may be an Aero.
- III** Milward plastic shuttle, top and side (England ebay item)
- IV** A heavy metal post shuttle with no markings (England ebay item)
- V** Pink and blue plastic post shuttles (England ebay item)
- VI** Plastic post shuttle with rivot in post (England ebay item)
- VII** France shuttle, B^TE^OU^S PAYS (England ebay item)
- VIII** Plastic button shuttle from Rita (Hector, NY)
- IX** A GMA beading shuttle (\$45). The wood is called Pink Ivory and its from South Africa and considered to be one of the rarest of woods. It is the most expensive, costing about 5 times as much as other exotic hardwoods. Carved by David Stanbrough (dave_stanbrough@hotmail.com) <http://www.grizzlymountainarts.com/shuttles.html>
- X** YULE shuttle, a bone shuttle carved by Sally Pointer (sallypointer@yahoo.co.uk), Mountain Ash, Rhondda Cynon Taff, CF45 3BL, United Kingdom. Natural creamy white bone that has been tannin stained to help show off the engraving. 6.5cm long and with good ends (GBP 20.00+shipping)
