Victoria Ong is an emerging lace artist from Chicago, IL who is known for teaching and writing about needle lace flowers. She published her first book *Flowers in Threads: Needle Lace for Beginners* in 2018, and her second book *Flowers in Threads: Intermediate and Advanced Patterns for Needle Lace* in 2019. She is currently working on a final book on lace edgings to complete the series.

In this workshop, Victoria will teach beginners how to create edgings and a beautiful scarf flower motif.

Learning Points:

- Knots and loops-the fundamental units of Needle Lace
- Increasing loops in a row
- Decreasing loops in a row
- Casting on a new Color or adding more thread
- Good practice with tail ends and casting on
- Undoing knots and mistakes
- The effects of outlining
- Creating large loops the same size



Virtual Class Details:

- 8:30-9 Zoom setup (Sat only); classes are 9-10:30 AM and 11-12:30 Sat and Sunday
- Same project, divided up by day - Sat for the basics and handkerchief edging, and Sun for the dogwood flower and bi-color fringe edging.
- Cost is \$55 plus \$5 for shipping of the materials/goodie bag.

- The bag will contain the pattern instructions, a practice template, ribbon to practice edgings and to make a name tag; 1 magnetic backing for a name tag; 1 x hemstitched edged hanky; 1 x size #18 tapestry needle; and size 10 Lizbeth thread for practice.
- Bring to Class: Sharp scissor; Seam ripper; desk light; Optional: Lizbeth thread in size 20 or 40 (or 10 if you want a specific color). You may want to get or have on hand a ball of size 10 white for the hanky.
- 2 colors of thread is recommended. If you wish to use a different size thread:
#20 Tapestry Needle - Lizbeth Thread #20 #22 Tapestry Needle - Lizbeth Thread #40
- We will email out the Google Meet invite closer to the date.
